**Subject: Complaint - Interference with ADSL Service**

Since I became an Infochannel customer I have been informing you of my case against the criminal enterprise responsible for the theft and retention of my BSc. Engineering Honours thesis (1983) in the programme of *apartheid* maintained by the University of Aberdeen and their accomplices. I brought the matter to your attention because of the stalking operation that includes hacking into my computer, destroying files, and interfering with my Internet service. The stalking operation is organised through MIT Professor James Williams with the assistance of agents in Jamaica. In the context of these discussions I wish to lodge a written complaint concerning the current interference causing loss of a reliable ADSL service, which I first brought to your attention 2 months ago.

You will recall that the interference with my ADSL connection began with intermittent disconnection from the internet evidenced by the discrete cyclical blinking of the internet and DSL status lights on my Speedtouch modem, then progressed to modem blackouts for continuous periods, notably those of Saturday 26 May from about 7:00 am to 10:00 am and, yesterday, Monday 26 June from approximately 6:30 pm to 9:30 pm. I spoke by telephone with your Customer Service Manager, Gregory McCreath, each time. Yesterday, Mr. McCreath ran checks on the system and informed me that he had observed that there was no transfer of data from Cable and Wireless Ltd in respect of my account, hence the blackout. You may recall that some weeks ago, I expressed the belief that Cable and Wireless was responsible for generating the communications blackouts.

I use the internet primarily for my work in Lisp and engineering mathematics related to research in computer vision (which I hope to continue with Professor Eric Grimson at MIT), to do the legal research required for drafting the various criminal complaints, and for communicating with law enforcement

agencies such as the International Criminal Court. As I indicated to both Mr. McCreath and you, the blackouts are designed to frustrate my access to the Internet, contributing to the sophisticated operations to cover-up the crimes.

I emphasize that, masked by the purported legitimacy of Williams' tenure at MIT, the criminal enterprise manages the cover-up through various forms of bribery, and that their repertoire now includes armed robbery and murder. I have attached for your information, a copy of Appendix A of my Pre-Indictment Brief to the ICC, filed 5 October 2006 (ICC reference numbers 113-07/VZ/OO, and OTP-CR-313/04). The latter Appendix is a comprehensive list of all reports filed with the various law enforcement agencies, including the Jamaican Authorities - and which have been summarily disregarded by the highly sophisticated and well-resourced cover-up. Accordingly, this complaint is for the attention of your Chief Executive Officer, Mr. Patrick Terrelonge who is best positioned to route the complaint through the appropriate channels at Cable and wireless.
