Dear Professor Diamond:

Notification under sections 7 and 10 of the Data Protection Act 1998

I enclose the captioned demand for your personal attention as Principal and Vice-Chancellor of the University of Aberdeen – an institution that enjoys the privilege of accreditation by the Privy Council, but maintains a regime of *apartheid* involving fraud against black/non-white students, theft of their property and the consequent award of bogus degrees. The documents in the matter are being uploaded to <https://sites.google.com/site/caprica313113/> which is publicly accessible.

While formalising the licence for GNU C-Graph <http://www.gnu.org/software/c-graph>, I recognized that agents of the University were attempting to block my assertion of “sole author” in the copyright notice. The evidence shows that the Fortran Program in my Honours Thesis was created in my Honeywell account under my user id uen4059 in October 1982, and shows further that it was the object code form of my Program that constituted the substantive work defining Colin MacLean's PhD Thesis which you secretly rescinded in March 2003. Since you appear to have a persuasive explanation as to how and why MacLean was able to access my account to supposedly author the code underlying his PhD Thesis, you should put this explanation in writing instead of whispering behind my back.

There is nothing to prevent MacLean earning the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in Engineering if, in fact, he is capable of doing his own work. But no amount of coercion, attacks on my family – or murder – will induce me to give my Fortran Program to Maclean, falsely crediting him as the author of work that originated from my own “exercise of independent critical powers”. The idea that I would ever agree to such a device is as delusional as the expectations that your false letter of invitation in 1985 soliciting my

application to the PhD programme in Engineering (supported by the denial of livelihood and access to PHD programmes elsewhere) would ever accomplish my return to the racial abuses practised by the School of Engineering with the knowledge and approval of the University's governing body.

As my two-month reproduction of the Fortran Program for GNU C-Graph demonstrated,¹ my Fortran Program (while declared to be exceptional by your Academic Standards Committee by virtue of the conferral of MacLean's PhD award) is hardly what I would produce for a PhD dissertation given the opportunity for entry to a legitimate doctoral program of three or more years duration. Please note that paragraph 1(l) of my notification emphasizes that GNU C-Graph is not available to the University for assessment towards any kind of degree.

The University's enjoyment of the de facto privilege of immunity to prosecution (awarded by law enforcement agencies led in their obstruction of justice by the International Criminal Court itself) bears some similarity to the 18th century attempts to prosecute the officers and crew of the slaveship known as the Zong for the murder of 133 slaves, who were thrown overboard alive. As your University Secretary advised me in 1983, one of my external examiners was the Vice-Chancellor for a prestigious English university – an *honourable* man held in the *highest regard*:²

What is this claim that human people have been thrown overboard? This is a case of chattels or goods. Blacks are goods and property; it is madness to accuse these well-serving *honourable* men of murder. They acted out of necessity and in the most appropriate manner for the cause. The late Captain Collingwood acted in the interest of his ship to protect the safety of his crew. To question the judgement of an experienced well-travelled captain held in the *highest regard* is one of folly, especially when talking of slaves. The case is the same as if wood had been thrown overboard.

Coincidentally, the country to which the Zong sailed from Africa in 1781, was Jamaica. John Lee, the Solicitor-General for England and Wales summed up the school of thought that still obtains today: an honourable man could drown slaves without “a surmise of impropriety”. This time the impunity will not survive, for those of us who have been awarded bogus degrees have, indeed, been thrown overboard.
